## 2017 Winter Teen Retreat

The annual Winter Teen Retreat was held at Spruce Lake Retreat Center in Canadensis, PA, the weekend of February 10-12, 2017. There were 28 attendees at the 2016 event, including 23 students and 5 adult chaperones.

Our keynote speaker was Fr. Stephen Vernak (Christ the Saviour, Harrisburg, PA). We were also joined by Fr. Daniel Ressetar (Christ the Saviour, Harrisburg, PA) for a special afternoon session on Saturday.

## St. Tikhon's Summer Camp

The 2017 season of St. Tikhon's Summer Camp was held from July 2-8. A total of 113 campers ages 7-17 came from across the country (and various jurisdictions) to participate in the program. One camper even joined us all the way from Paris, France! Our hard-working staff of 56 adult volunteers helped make the event a success once again.

- Rev. Timothy Hojnicki was present as the Youth Chaplain for the week. His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon also visited with the campers this year.
- In addition to field games, boating, swimming, and arts & crafts, campers also had the opportunity to participate in iconography classes (Susan Shiposki; Holy Cross, Williamsport, PA) and ethnic dancing classes (Emilia Resanovic; Serbian Orthodox Monastery Marcha, Richfield, OH).
- Forty-two of the 113 campers participated in the Teen Camp program led annually by John D. Bohush IV (St. Elia, Akron, OH).
